Convention Reports

The CON-DOR 97 Convention by Michael Robbins (Borg K'Mpec)

This was a nice convention with a surprise guest star - it was none other than Max Grodenchik who plays Rom on DS9. For some strange reason Max likes to show up at the San Diego convention unannounced! BullG StaVanES (John Stevens) and I had a very nice casual chat with Max, talking about anything and everything including DS9 and Rom. Ever since John and I provided security for Max at another convention, we have become friends with him and he really loves being escorted by Klingons. However, we couldn't really ask him (directly) about any future DS9 episodes.

There were some interesting panel discussions - one panel was entitled "Is there too much Star Trek?" What do you think? Or should the questions have been 'is there too much or too little good Star Trek?' Or is there too much or too little BAD Star Trek?' I basically think that there are far too many bad Star Trek episodes and far too few good ones!

I participated in two of the panels, the first one was called 'Meeting of the Minds: Second Khitomer Conference'. I sat on this panel as Borg K'mpec and BullG StaVanES was the other Klingon representative. The rest of the panel was comprised of Bajoran, Romulan and Federation Ambassadors. This was a really fun panel as everybody got to live role-play their character. We were there to discuss the current problem of the Dominion and the Jem'Hadar and how to begin to deal with them!?! Even the audience participated, two concerned Terrans played the parts of news reporters - one from ISN (Interstellar Network News) and the other represented UPN (United Planetary Network News!).

The other panel that I took part in was simply called 'Klingon Rite of Ascension'. This panel was actually like the Klingon celebration at TigorKor (from the DS9 episode Apocalypse Rising). This was mainly a Klingon Party but the local Terrans were not allowed to leave until they joined in singing the Klingon Ritual Hunt song (from the ST:TNG episodes Birthright 1 & 2). Next year's CON-DOR VI's dates are February 27 - March 1 1998.

Other Upcoming Conventions - GSA

There should be at least three conventions back-to-back within two weeks of each other. First up is WESTERCON 51 (July 2 - 5 1998) held here in San Diego. This will be the biggest convention hosted in San Diego next year and will be a typical GSA four day con. Next is COMICCON International, another four day convention. The exact dates are unknown at present but my best guess is two/three weeks after WESTERCON 51. Thirdly, FANTASTICON - this will be held in Los Angeles, California during the first weekend in August of next year. As soon as I have any information on this con, I will pass it along - if you want to see a lot of Star Trek actors & actresses,

FANTASTICON is the American convention to go to. It's also one of the few cons in the USA that is fan-run.

The Starfleet Ball by Fleet Captain K'Lay zantai Kronsei-Chang

Here in America, especially in California, one often gets to see the stars of Star Trek at big conventions. It's not at all unusual to see several of them... sometimes even 20 or 30 or more of them... at the same convention. What is unusual in Britain is the degree of familiarity one gets to have with them, and also the degree of camaraderie one gets to share with one's fellow convention mates. The USA is so large that most of us in GSA, with rare exceptions, have never even met each other. Not so in GSE.

I arrived in London, not knowing quite what to expect from the country, the people, or the convention. But those doubts were immediately put to rest when Fleet Captain Kara Druidh arrived at the airport to greet me, and I spent the rest of the week with Fleet Captain Arizhel Kehoz, her husband, my GSE Global Security counterpart, Captain Khey'ra Druidh and others, touring round the countryside and being entertained like royalty. The warm welcome snowballed from there until I had met dozens of the people I had only heretofore known from letters.

The Starfleet Ball was fabulous, and I felt like Cinderella, surrounded by family (NO, no no! Not the wicked step sisters! The British sisterhood... specifically the Druid sisters are much better!) Tony Todd was an interesting speaker; (he had the most ingenious ideas about swimming with ducks) and I got the chance to shake his hand and growl at him while he was having drinks with more of the KSF at the bar.

And I can easily see why the stars think that conventions in Britain are so much fun. For one thing; I've never had occasion to blow up condoms (for condom races or anything else) at a US convention, or participated in a chocolate ceremony where I was encouraged.. nay... ordered to throw things at the Federation! We don't have cider either... or Kambei's lethally potent Romulan Ale. And you have not known true humour until you've seen half a dozen Klingon warriors in full armour trying to do the Macarena. (If someone has a video tape of that, I'll pay good latinum for it!) The UK in general, and British Star Trek conventions in particular, have earned my highest recommendation: Come for the fun of it. The weather is cool, the people are warm, and GSE's conventions are HOT!

Starfleet Ball - by Khey'ra

K'lay and I decloaked over Bourmemouth and shortly after checking in and registering, we went to help with the preparations for the Klingon party. Then, somebody lost the key to the Druid sisters' guest quarters. We were not amused and swore a blood oath in case the key could not be found. Luckily, Manny, AKA K'nary Worf, located the coordinates of the key, which was hiding under a pile of space junk. By the time we gained access to our guest quarters, it was time to change into Klingon attire. This time the ritual went without the spillage of latex over any costumes or spirit gum over headpieces, a very good omen indeed.

We started the evening with the chocolate worshipping ritual. Kambei, Vallis, K'nary Worf and Kranze portrayed the chocolate priests and some of the girls, including myself, were the acolytes. We managed to combine the throwing chocolate coins into the audience with the shouting of the words "nuqDaq yuch Dapol. It was a hoot. This act was followed by the Duress sisters cabaret, a couple of presentations and, finally, the disco, that went on until the early hours of Saturday morning. Plenty of Romulan Ale was consumed. Khey'Ra missed the condom race, but she has got a good alibi. It was a matter of either an urgent food intake or fading away. K'lay and Khey'Ra went for a bag of crisps. Tony Todd turned up after midnight and an unknown Klingon encouraged him to join the crowds on the dance floor - a rare event. He doesn't usually dance at conventions

Tony Todd's first talk was very entertaining, especially when he demanded, we liberate our ducks. There were three plastic ducks in each hotel room and Tony wanted us to take them to the hotel swimming pool. Although, I saw

many ducks around the hotel, including Klingon, Romulan, Toilet and other alien ducks, somehow, they didn't manage to find their way to the pool, much to Tony's disappointment.

The Ball itself took place Saturday night but preparations began in the afternoon. I had to help my sister Kara to decide how and where to position the medals on her cloak for maximum effect. Judging by the fact that she dazzled everybody with her cloak, I would say, we got it right. Kara looked stunning. Vallis surprised me when she put her Cardassian head on. "It's the wrong ridges", I thought. Fortunately, she changed back into her cheerful Klingon self, in time for the Ball.

We gathered in Arizhel's room and then headed for the ball room. All attendees were announced by the master of ceremonies and introduced to the committee, a very formal affair. As soon as everybody was seated, the meal was served. It was excellent, Klingon cuisine at its best. George Marshal entertained the audience after the meal and, by the time he finished the cabaret, everybody was in high spirits. Then, the disco began and we headed for the dance floor. We had fun until the early hours of the morning, including fooling around with red balloons.

Sunday was a quiet. K'lay had to leave early. Tony Todd held another talk around lunch time. He was very tired. I heard later, he played poker until six o'clock in the morning. Still, in true Klingon fashion, he went on with the talk, which turned out to be quite informative and entertaining. We learned about his latest film deal, that only just came through. The autograph session took place in the afternoon and was followed by the Tony Todd fan club meeting. During the meeting, we presented Tony with a Tribble, which promptly began to disintegrate when he touched it. Tony and T'Uhlor exchanged frogs, and Tony presented T'Uhlor with marmalade. T'Uhlor knows the significance and a big smile on her face told me, she enjoyed the presentation

The rest of the day was spent with general chit-chat and mingling. There was another party in the evening but we were exhausted. Still, we made the effort and got there just in time for the Terran karaoke, but Klingons are spoilt when it comes to good music, so we decided not to stay and went up to our room to watch the video of the convention instead. It was quite amusing. Can't wait to see the rest of it.

Eaten Any Good Books Recently ?

The Joy Machine : A Novel by James Gunn , Based on a Story by Theodore Sturgeon. Reviewed by Khaji KMpec / Tristram Walker

The Joy Machine is a machine capable of giving its user pure and unadulterated joy. Timshel is the holiday spot of the Federation. Unknown events have caused Timshel to close its borders. Two federation agents were sent to investigate but they never returned. It is now up to James T. Kirk and the crew of the Enterprise to discover the secret of Timshel , but can they resist the temptation of pure joy ?

My first impression of this book was oh no it can't be that good if it wasn't made into an episode because The Joy Machine is based on a story by Theodore Sturgeon that never made it as a 'real' episode. However my fears were unfounded.

This is a very good novel and a marked improvement on Pocket Books last Classic Trek offering (Invasion Bk 1 : First Strike, ugh !).

Star Trek is famous for having a moral , and this book is no exception . This is clearly a drugs allegory but it differs from the TNG episode ' Symbiosis ' in that the reader is allowed to make the choice as to whether the Joy Machine is bad or not. Kirk and crew have come up against super-computers before but again the Joy Machine provides a different way of looking at how technology could ruin our lives.

My only moans are that the book focused largely on Kirk, whereas I would have preferred a more equal coverage of the crew and not just "Hey Jim while you were away we did this ... ". My second moan is - Since when did Kirk start quoting poetry; surely that is reserved for Picard.

Overall The Joy Machine is a good book and I would recommend it to all fans of Star Trek. 8 / 10.



Family History - Birth to Nentay

I am Gorec (ghoreq), the son of K'mpec (q'mpec). My family has ruled the Empire for over eighty years. During this time K'mpec was Leader of the High Council on Kronos (Qo'noS) and his many accolades are to numerous to list. I was born on Kronos, the second son of the house of K'mpec and I lived and trained alongside my elder brother Kavok (qavok) for most of my young life. I worked very hard all the way through my peHghep and my nenghep until finally the day of my nentay arrived. This considerably impressed the rest of the crew who treated me with more respect afterward, and I then made it my business to befriend the man whom I had replaced as I had already proved myself superior and had no wish to further question his honour. We became close friends and I had gained a very loyal ally!

I served on that ship for many years and gained a considerable amount of honour and glory, so much so that I was deemed worthy of a more delicate but important post. My new position was as diplomatic attaché to the Federation and as such I acted as a liaison between the Empire and the United Federation of Planets. The rest of the mission details are classified by Imperial security and are not available.

It was while on this extended mission that I met my mate, T'prish of Vulcan. I was taking a short stay on Vulcan when I met and became immediately enamoured with her. We were mated shortly thereafter and one year later my son Kraltor (Qaltor) was born.

After the mission was complete we remained on Vulcan for a brief period before returning to Kronos where we lived in First City for many years until after Kraltor's Age of Inclusion. I then felt it necessary to take an extended leave of absence for religious enlightenment on the Temple World of Borath. However, I did not think it appropriate to force the rest of my family to join me on what was a very personal quest. Therefore, T'prish returned to Vulcan to complete the Kohlinar discipline which she suspended after our marriage, Kraltor was adopted to my brother Kavok's House. This was a wise decision as Kavok had just joined our father K'mpec on the High Council, making our combined Houses very influential in the Empire! Kraltor received the rest of his warrior training with them on Kronos until the treachery of the Duras family led to the untimely and cowardly assassination of K'mpec.

Klingon Civil War

Kavok sent a coded message to me on Borath and when he advised me of the situation and of the Duras' deeds I returned to Kronos immediately and when civil war broke out

my brother and I both threw our banners in with Gowron (ghowron) against the Duras family. We both took Commands of our own and while Kavok captained the I.K.V. yay (Victory) I commanded the I.K.V. Suvwl' (Warrior). This was my first major command, but as one of the heads of our house it was absolutely necessary. Meanwhile, I assigned a small command to Kraltor in the shape of the k'tinga class scoutship I.K.V. nejwl' (Searcher), which he captained admirably for his first attempt. The glorious battles that followed are too many to list but among the most important were the supply raids at Beta Thoridor and the surprise attack that involved half of Gowron's fleet and exposed the Romulan connection with the Duras' bid for power.

One of my most vivid memories is of a battle near Beta Thoridor in which my ship, a K'vort class Bird of Prey was under attack from a Vorcha' class Attack Cruiser. The Vorcha was far more powerful and I quickly realised that a full frontal assault, while glorious in intent, would avail us naught against the forward disrupter array of this monstrous ship. To be honest I still don't know how the Duras' Fleet acquired such a vessel as I had previously believed that production was limited to the flagship (I.K.V. BortaS) alone. However none of this mattered and I set about formulating a strategy to combat it's strength. My officer in charge of long-range sensors detected a planet nearby which had a very strong magnetic field and volatile atmosphere. I ordered helm to set course Warp 7 and the Attack Cruiser followed. When we were near enough we dropped out of warp and headed for the upper atmosphere at three-quarters impulse until we were almost in the stratosphere, our greater maneuverability giving us the edge, then as our pursuer followed us in we hit warp at a very high angle causing the atmosphere to jump and engulf the enemy. He was stranded without the ability to escape and we swung around and brought full disrupters to bear. His shields collapsed and we finished him off in no time! Quite a victory for such an outmatched ship!

Events Part II

Gowron's forces were victorious but the price was high, and Kavok was never the same again. He blamed the Federation for the death of our father and Jean-Luc Picard in particular for what he saw as a gross lack of action! He began making covert plans which only surfaced later, however he did start to exhibit strange behaviour which was a clue that something was wrong. Years passed and in the meantime Kraltor was reintegrated into my House. Everything seemed to have returned to normal, then Kavok stole the Enterprise and flew back home to Kronos in an attempt to start a war and make the Federation pay, however he was overpowered by several crewmen who were still onboard and all-out war was averted.

We lived on Kronos for several years afterwards until the threat of the Dominion forced Gowron to act and invade Cardassia. Both myself and Kraltor were of course at his side, as was most of the Empire!

Cardassian Wars

This is undoubtedly the most exciting time of my life to date and the adventures had only just begun at the compiling of this report.

With the introduction of a new Flagship there were more vorch'a' class cruisers to be had and our family took delivery of at least six including my new ship the I.K.V. Qaw'wl' (Destroyer).

During this period I was involved in a number of battles and the size and power of the Qaw'wl' meant that these encounters were by no means small ones. While smaller ships such as Krator's nejwl' could handle the smaller Cardassian Warship classes such as the small Krelon class, my ship took on the large Galor class ships and had more than sufficient power to destroy them with a fair degree of ease!

The largest battle which ensued was the full scale attack on the Cardassian built station "Terok nor" now called D.S.9. The assault involved approximately one third of our fleet and was led by Gowron himself onboard his new flagship. Given sufficient time we would have obliterated the station but with the imminent arrival of more Federation starships including the U.S.S. Venture, a Galaxy class warship, Gowron ordered a reprieve to consider the Alpha Quadrant situation more closely. He was not prepared to risk handing control of our space and our home planets to the Dominion by an all-out war with the Federation, the Cardassians or anyone else until he had conclusive proof that those people were under the Founders control. He decided that continuing the current battle before further analysis of the situation could weaken our forces unnecessarily. He was however unwilling to give up the Cardassian colonies that we took during the invasion, and in fact they are still ours.

Lt. Koloth sutai K'Tama: Has taken over I.S. Command, GSA and is doing a superb job.


GSA Sector 4



Android Eyeballs in Worm Goulash
 Spaghetti and Meatballs Filled with Halved Eggs - recipe sent in by Morag L'Kor

Ingredients

Prepared sauce from store or home made
 10 boiled eggs
 1 pound ground beef or pork

salt
pepper
garlic powder
1 raw egg
1/2 cup seasoned bread crumbs
1 teaspoon oil
1 box of thin noodles

Method

Remove shells from the eggs. Mix meat, raw eggs, 1 teaspoon each of salt, pepper, garlic powder, then add bread crumbs. Cover the shelled boiled eggs with meat and form into balls. The station was now looking more like it should. We are now fully operational and down on Rockhaven I set up two outposts with the ability to monitor this area of space, two well-armed warning satellites in a wide orbit, and have established a comlink with Kronos. As a result of my last mission I have a Galaxy Class starship as a prize and a Starfleet Admiral in my brig. Capt. Ka'at Jo-el is having the time of his life checking it all

out and installing a cloaking device on board. Soon news came of activity on the planet Stork's Nest, and we headed out. Romulans were popping up in a number of places; K'Pril was working under cover to check these reports. The planet's surface was barren and hot, desert stretching out for miles. Ahead was a mountain range; ship's scanners showed humanoid life forms. We chose to walk there. It was only at the mountain top that these life forms registered on the tricorders. Below on the plateau lay a Cardassian craft and a well armed patrol. With disruptors on full Kruge ordered to kill all of them but the commander. Blinded by rage, Kruge grasped the Cardassian by the throat, lifting him off the ground with one arm. "You will tell me I can assure you of that." He ordered him beamed up to the brig. Kruge turned his attention to the Cardassian shuttlecraft. He found the computer was a simple type and ordered the data downloaded to his ship.

A young officer volunteered to be surgically changed to a dead Cardassian officer and placed on the planet to await the return of the mother ship, to learn the purpose of the Cardassian presence there. I was picked up by a Cardassian starship Star Union with a crew of 65. I found out its course had taken it around a lot of the Triangle, and was now taking us to the far edge of the Empire. It met a Romulan warbird; the captain, Gul Vom, beamed over. I decided to risk tapping into the ship's computer. Gulag code only gave me level 4 access; I needed a level 6 to get at the mission orders, but I had learned a thing or two on my father's ship. I rearranged some chips and in a few minutes broke in. The ship's mission was to contact four Klingon groups that want to break up Klingon/Federation treaties and start a war. I learned where their meetings were to be. Capt. Ka'at reports receiving orders from Kruge to report to the captured Galaxy class Starship. Enroute he studied data on Galaxy class ships from the USS Nelson he had once captured. Once on board, he had the crew prepare a jamming field so no one could detect that the ship has a Klingon crew. They discovered the USS Atlanta had greatly enhanced weapons, shields and sensor systems. GLOBAL SECURITY (qo'Hung)
GSA: Fleet Captain K'Lay zanta
Kronsei-Chang:

The Dominion has made greater inroads into our quadrant than was previously suspected, threatening not only open war, but conducting covert ops into the heart of our Command structure. General Martok was not the only victim of a changling exchange. The shape shifters appear to have focused special attention on Global Security, perhaps because we are known to guard and escort the VIPs of Empire. Khorghan has escaped the rift, where the false "Sarena" lured him, but only by the skin of his teeth and without his ship, the IKV GLORY SEEKER. He brings word of a Dominion staging area base.

After K'Lay Kronsei-Chang's arrest on charges of treason, a Chang changling look alike slipped on board the COLD REVENGE. Luckily, it was both detected and captured by a diligent K'Mar Kurka who was not misled by its appearance. But it spoke of "new friends in the Alpha Quadrant", a disquieting boast that Sarena Zu Merz wants to learn more about. She believes the shifter might, among other crimes, be responsible for the acts of treason attributed to the real Kronsei-Chang. In any case, it will have information useful in combating the Dominion threat. This promises to be a fight to the death, and one we cannot win alone. Knowing this, Gowron has made at least a temporary Alliance with the Federation. But it is not an easy truce for some on either side, and it took all of Ju'ngah Chang's skill as a warrior and a diplomat to avert a lethal confrontation between some Fed ships and one of ours. If we are to avert disaster, we must put our differences aside and remember that the enemy of our enemy is our ally, even if they are Star Fleet, Rom, dissident Cardassians or the rebel Maquis.

With this in mind, I.I. Commander Arizhel Kehoz and the real K'Lay Kronsei-Chang have come up with a plan to win the trust and enlist Maquis help. To do this Kaufen Juriss was chosen to help the still officially renegade K'Lay "escape" from I.I. custody, and to transport her to a secret location where she will meet with the Maquis. What he found, upon attempting the rescue, was that the II shuttle had been taken over by shape shifters, and that, in addition to trying to kill the real K'Lay, they had plans to discredit and undermine Arizhel's authority. Leaving nothing to chance, Khaufen made sure these changlings would be unable to carry out their strategy, but where there is one changling, there may be more, and it has become obvious that no one can afford to let their guard down now. We are at war....with allies who look like enemies and with enemies who may look like friends.

GLOBAL SECURITY/GSE:

K'wen repaired her communications system but wasn't able to prevent the assassination of Kor'Sheth, who was held in the GS brig on K'Shona. Her sensors indicated a lifeform, a Tellnun, on board the spy craft, which got through to


K'Shona. The Tellnun is in an alien environment and dying from exhaustion. While K'wen investigated the alien, Ordale, the shapeshifter, attacked her but K'wen fought back. He fled; a chase began and Ordale was able to board his craft and leave K'Shona—but he didn't get far. K'wen, now aboard her DEATHBIRD, soon caught up with him and killed him. She returned to K'Shona with an alien body on board and a prize Federation spy ship in tow. GSE/GS, in cooperation with Triangle Command, had to find the origins of the mysterious signals Khey'Ra had discovered earlier. Vanar investigated the signals and discovered a Vulcan ship near the Triangle/Romulan border. It self-destructed when she hailed it and she was unable to take prisoners. A Vulcan/human fusion revealed under torture that the Vulcans intended to meet the Romulans, nothing more. Vanar decided on an undercover mission, and was transported on board a Romulan ship where she met her Romulan contact. She learned the Romulans planned to form an alliance with the Vulcans and that negotiations had begun. Vanar couldn't go to Romulus; there was a real danger her cover could be blown. Jacen collected Vanar from the Romulan ship and returned her to K'Shona.

When I heard from Major Mara K'nera she was still in command of my ship the IKV Imia Kardac. They still have no idea where K'Pril could be. They picked up a trail on the planet but soon lost it. The last thing they got from her was a little black cube. I received this cube the next day. It showed a hologram of K'Pril. She said that she was following a woman...the rest of the message was missing.



COVERT MILITARY COMMAND
GSA: (vangmey pegh ra'ghom):
Lt.Cmdr.Reyna vestai-Kor,

IKV Qor yay Hem crew members completed their Zymerian mission reports and research assignments. Ens. Maw'wu' Karizan recovered well from his brain injury which was a side effect of a botched "false memory" implant. All shore leaves were taken at Starbase K'SHONA. A pre-mission briefing was held at 13 standard solar hours on Hovjaj 9702.01. I communicated via scrambled comm code to LCdr. Ke'reth Makura; a strategic rendezvous point on the Cardassian border was agreed upon, and reached on schedule on Hovjaj 9702.02. We agreed on a priority targeted "kill": the Galor class vessel Garrick, which intelligence reports have indicated was responsible in part for attacking Klingon shipping. We would destroy all Cardassian vessels that crossed our path. Any captured prisoners would be

interrogated and then disposed of pending orders from High Command.

Ens. Maw'qu' Karizan: Have boarded Cmdr. Kor's ship to begin battle preparations against the Cardassians; hope to engage Jem'Hadar too. Have met the Restless Shadow, hope our two ships will be first in battle. A promotion and killing Jem'Hadar and Cardassians would bring me much glory. But I don't like fighting along with Romulans who I hate!

TROUBLESHOOTER TASKFORCE: Lt.Cmdr Borg K'Mpec:

The Troubleshooters stayed at home port just long enough to re supply. I have come to know that if the Zymerians send one vessel into an area, a dozen more will follow. My best guess is that they are en route to Rockhaven, so we set course, arriving just as a squad of Zymerian vessels also arrived. I noticed a lone Vor'Cha orbiting Space Station P-12; I decided not to warn them, but let it act as a decoy. I ordered the Taskforce into the K'Mpec formation and began the attack. The battle was brief, fast and furious. The Task Force destroyed the Zymerians. One tried to blindside-ram the Vor'Cha. It was destroyed by the IKV Bloodlust within 500 kelikams of it. The IKV Sengbachwl' was destroyed in the Battle of Rockhaven by, I believe, friendly fire. Its crew is safely aboard IKV Tenacity Force I, undergoing medical treatment. Decoding the Zymerians' latest transmission I learned another squad of Zymerians were heading in the direction of Sherman's planet. En route, I hailed F Adm K'Zhen Zu-Merz to request another ship. By Kahless' luck, we arrived just ahead of the Zymerians; the battle lasted about 25 minutes. We destroyed them, but they destroyed the IKV Starburst Displacer Beast; its crew met an honorable death in true Klingon fashion.

(Note: Cmdr. Borg will be thoroughly debriefed concerning the loss of two valuable Imperial vessels.)



COVERT MILITARY COMMAND GSE LCdr.
Ke'reth sutai Makura

The Restless Shadow has returned to the neutral zone to hunt down a Romulan supply convoy to the planet THISISIT. Our mission: to observe, disrupt and if necessary attack and destroy. We have unconfirmed reports that the Romulans are hiring mercenaries; that a heavily armed convoy is bringing 10 thousand bars of Gold Pressed Latinum for their payment. I've been building up CMC forces in this area, linked up with IKV Kor's Proud Victory, CMC/GSA flagship. Have requested multidivisional backup.

Patrolling space near Nequencia 3, LCdr. Bath's BoP took out a Romulan science vessel and a scout ship. Taken momentarily off guard by three smaller warbirds, I took evasive action, then ordered all weapons to fire on the nearest one. It pitched in space, colliding with the vessel the Kor's Proud Victory was firing on. Both ships were destroyed. We chased the other vessel down and destroyed it. End of mission report; I've bigger fish to fry...

Personnel report: Katana vestai-Makura has always been invaluable. The IKV Restless Shadow has never performed better. Her courage and professionalism inspire the engineers working under her.

Kraxus Ka'tan, an Assassin, currently on a mission to Romulus, out of communication. If I've been lied to by my Romulan contact, I will not take it lightly.

K'Tesh vestai-Keashi: His D-16 class cruiser IKV Unconditional surrender was moved to the Cardassian border to confirm the rumor of a Cardassian Galor class vessel equipped with a Romulan cloaking device that has been attacking both Klingon and Federation ships in the demilitarized zone. Once he has confirmed this rumor his orders are to seek and destroy.

Darus Jak: C.O. of the Independent Bajoran Vessel IBV Blue Dragon has been ordered to Bajor's Rhat'al Province to collect a super heavy disruptor to be fitted to the IKV Nightstorm for use at the planet THISISIT.

Kull vs Jonos Kashgar: Temporarily assigned the use of a B'rel Class BoP. He's been working on multiple projects for the Empire for his K'vok Institute, part of the CMC's R and D Department.



IMPERIAL MARINE COMMAND -
(wo'blq'a' ra'ghom): Lt. K'Dahor vestai-P'Kallara:

These officers have been assigned to IMC on Kamato: Ltjg Gizmo vestai Koloth, a Combat Instructor, and Ltjg Kargh vestai-Jorcha, a Tactical Assault Officer. Lt Jorcha is in command of re-training the Stormbringer Assault Battalions, taking these forces on repeated assault exercises, including inter-company skirmishing to promote competition and improvement. He feels this will assist in tactical awareness of the marines, as many variables can come in to play in such exercises. Kargh is investigating a matter of toxic foodstuff found on Kamato and its use as a test of warriorhood by some troops. A number of marines have been hospitalised. A smuggling operation seems to be transporting the foodstuff off-planet. Lt Jorchas plans to have an SAB build up immunity to the toxins; this force can be used to destroy the smuggling operation; the medical benefits from them will provide a defense against the toxins for others. Ship to ship assaults also need practice. IMC awaits the arrival of an appropriate vessel to utilise.

Lt Koloth has taken on the training of all other marine forces on Kamato. Each regiment is been rotated into the training program in turn, with at least two regiments in training at any given time. They have been assigned offensive or defensive orders as required. Those acting as defending forces have been positioned for indeterminate periods prior to combat, with orders to secure and police the area. The attacking force has been kept aboard the IKV raiSuS for the same period. These situations have provided more realistic combats, helping prepare the marines for short distance assaults from ships, from correctly stowing their equipment to

general shipboard behavior. A special demolition company has been formed from volunteers from each regiment under Lt Koloth's training command. This force has adopted the name Youngblood, to be trained in the arts of explosives and sabotage.

I have moved a third of my forces under cover of standard R&R rotation, travelling to Nequencia 3, transporting Stormbringer Assault Battalions and support units. The remaining marines on Kamato will continue exercises, observers will believe IMC is still active on the planet.

Lt Drekar vestai-Tor-am, as deputy governor, has secured control over the southern highlands of Kamato. Three more prison zones were constructed to hold enemies and subversives for re-education and work details. The secondary IMC base on the planet is at Kereo, close to several major cities.

Tor-am is using Hunter platoons to sweep all areas around his base of operations, resulting in approximately one thousand opposition deaths against five marine mortalities. This has reduced the rebels' standing; destroying their reputation. The marines are no longer required on Kamato, a more regular administration is needed to govern the planet. An item of interest is the continued discovery of Romulan weapons in use by rebels. They may be left over from before the invasion, but there is still a ready supply from off world. Though this requires an intelligence enquiry, IMC is too high-profile to successfully uncover any relevant information. I have continued my active operational status by serving as a line officer in some of the training exercises, allowing me access to a large number of marines and officers. The exercises are to prevent any softening up while we await our next mission.



MEDICAL OPS COMMAND GSE: - LCdr. K'Bath sutai-LoDnl':

I have taken command of a hospital ship, a project that has taken months of hard work to complete. A de-commissioned Vor'cha was made available for a M.A.S.H unit I wanted for the current conflict. It has the standard weapons array, cloaking device, heavily reinforced shields to take sustained attacks during evacuation procedures. All former cargo decks have been equipped as wards, dedicated operating theatres, etc. A small number of shuttlecraft will act as ambulance vessels. Though the crew have been hand-picked, one or two senior officers are under suspicion of being Dominion sympathisers, if not actual changelings.

About 3 light years from the rest of the fleet we ran into two Cardassian warships; they saw us about the same time we saw them so cloaking was pointless. Having the advantage of superior range, we blew the nearest cruiser out of the blackness. They fired back, but we crippled them with ease. I ordered the transport of the senior Cardassian officers to our brig for later interrogation. After finishing off the second

ship we beamed over its senior officers to hand over to Imperial Security.

I am not comfortable with the Romulans joining forces with us; I don't trust them. However this could be one heck of a battle when the Dominion chooses to come through the wormhole. We have a new discovery, known only as HD 60 975 P which may possibly prevent shapeshifters from returning to their liquid form, and/or changing from one solid shape to another to avoid detection. - Dujlij ylvoq - (Trust your instincts.)
